

HOLY WEEK HOSPITALITY

Christ called all people to follow the gospel and welcomed all to gather around the table. As Christ's church, we promise to practice simple ways of welcome and inclusion. Let us look past any discomfort or inconvenience of a full Church and enjoy the loving presence of a community coming together to praise God as one family!

We pray for all the needs of the world and then we are invited to come forward and venerate the cross, showing our gratitude for the suffering of Jesus and uniting our suffering to his.



HOLY SATURDAY OUR CALL TO WAIT

HOLY SATURDAY night is the holiest of all nights of the year. We anticipate a glorious evening as we gather with The Church of Saint Gregory for one Easter Vigil. This is the night we tell our whole story. It begins with the lighting of the Easter Fire and the blessing and lighting of the Easter Candle—a sign of the presence of Christ. In most places, all worshipers are given a candle, lit from the one candle. Then the Easter Proclamation is sung, an ancient song so holy it is sung only once a year. It is on this night that new members of the community are baptized, confirmed, and received into our church. We join them in the great renunciation of sin and profession of faith.

This service is longer, but it is so filled with imagery and the triumphant proclamation of the truth, that even small children are interested. And if they fall asleep on mom's lap or dad's shoulder— how lovely. This year, two new Paschal candles will be lit for the very first time at the end of this solemn liturgy and carried out in procession. They will be brought to Our Lady of the Snows and Saint Benedict's church on Easter morning.
